Their logic sequences share certain features...

- Identify common interests
- Build and maintain relationships
- Make contributions to collective actions
- Achieve (shared) outcomes

- Identify content
- Communicate
- Increase understanding
- Encourage actions (taken by others)
- Achieve outcomes

- Gather inputs
- Draft policy instruments
- Influence organizations/ individuals
- Encourage actions (taken by others)
- Achieve outcomes

- Request/receive applications
- Provide funding
- Support actions (taken by others)
- Achieve outcomes

One organization may use more than one approach. For example, an environmental organization may engage with stakeholders on climate change, share research findings about it, develop climate change policies to guide its operations and fund projects to reduce climate change impacts.
